

Northern Climate

- Immigrants settled in North




Critical Thinking Question A: What is the most logical order for arranging these topics in the flow chart?

- Ideal for farming


- Opposed to tariffs (taxes) on foreign imports on, tobacco, rice, and indigo grown as cash crops
