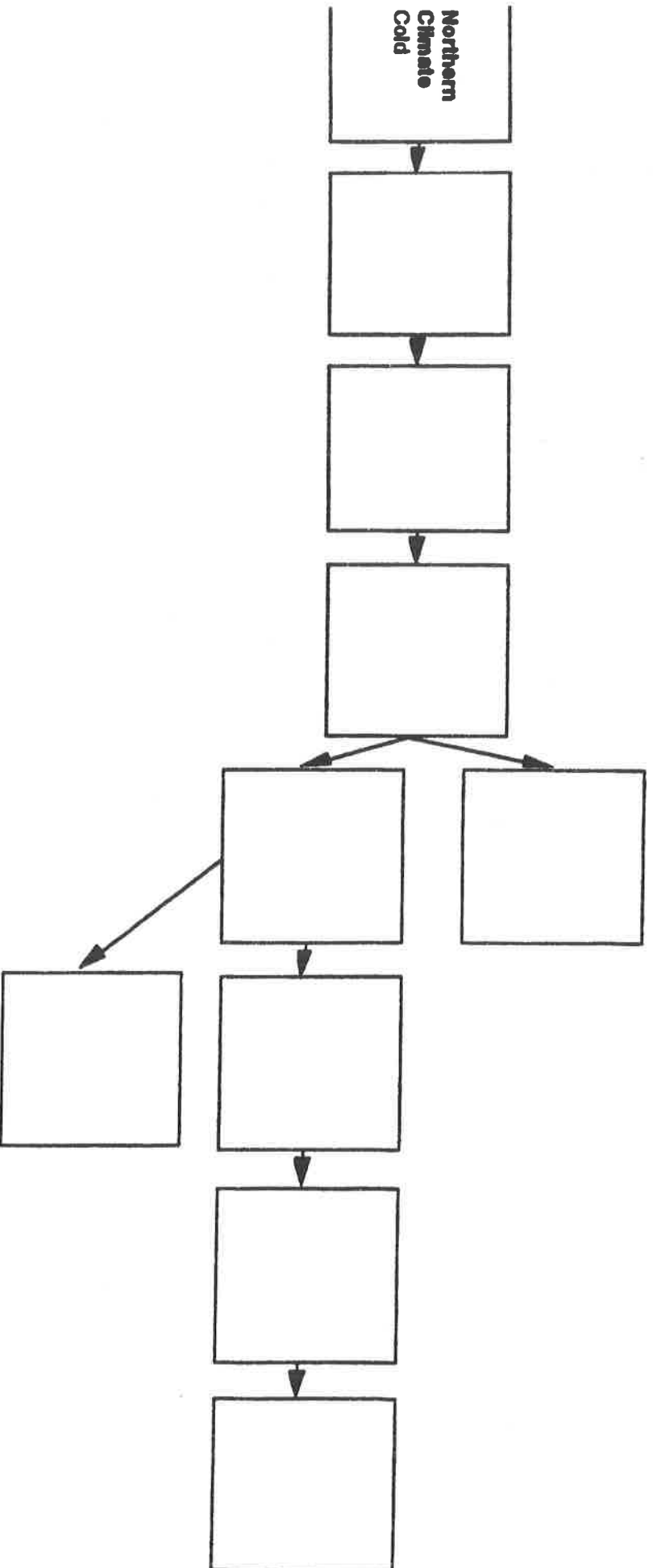


## Northern Climate



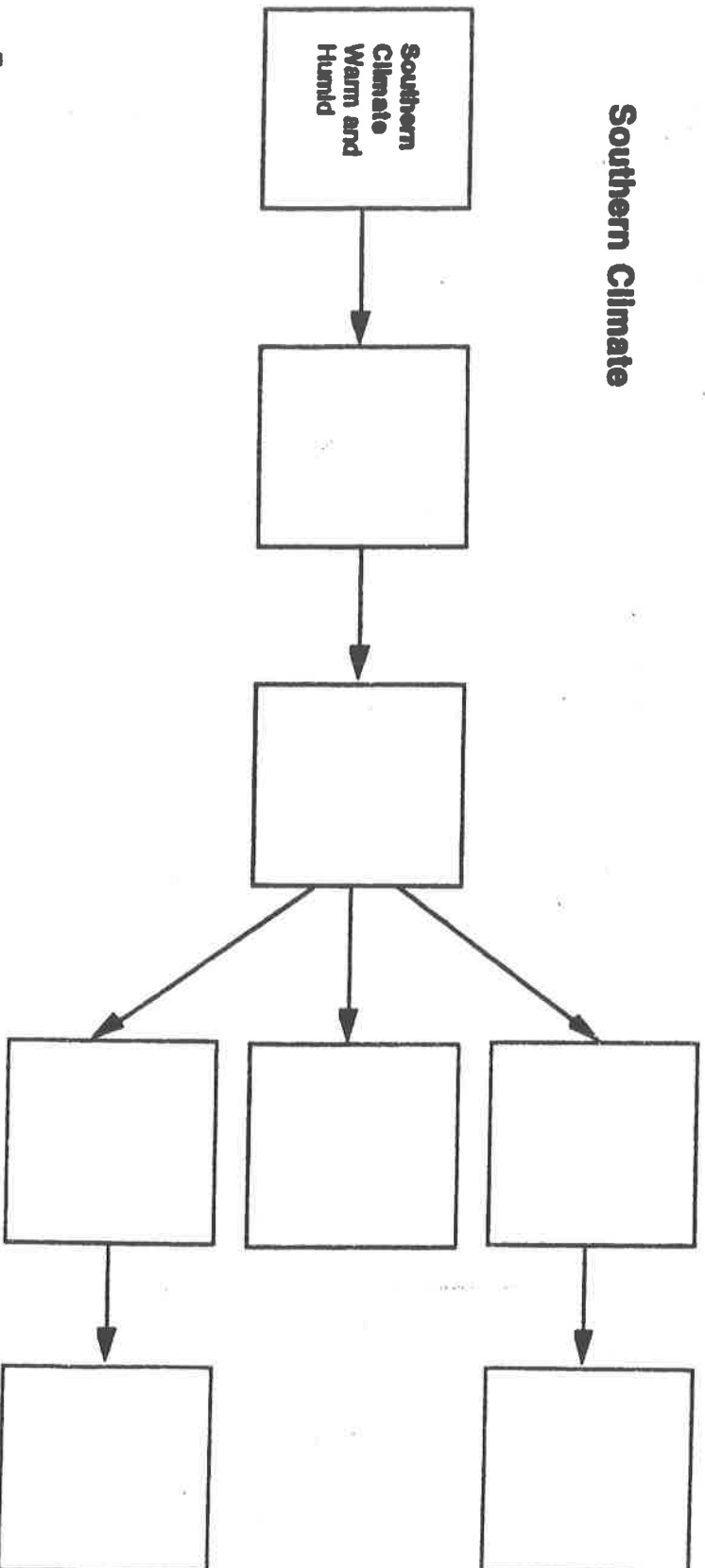
**Critical Thinking Question B:** What is the most logical order for arranging these topics in the flow chart?

- Manufacturing prospered
- Shipbuilding, fishing, mining, lumber, furs
- "Yankee ingenuity" used to create ways other than agriculture to make money
- Bad for farming much of the year
- Population increased rapidly
- Favored tariffs (taxes) on foreign imports
- Diverse (varied) economy
- Need for skilled labor
- Immigrants settled in North

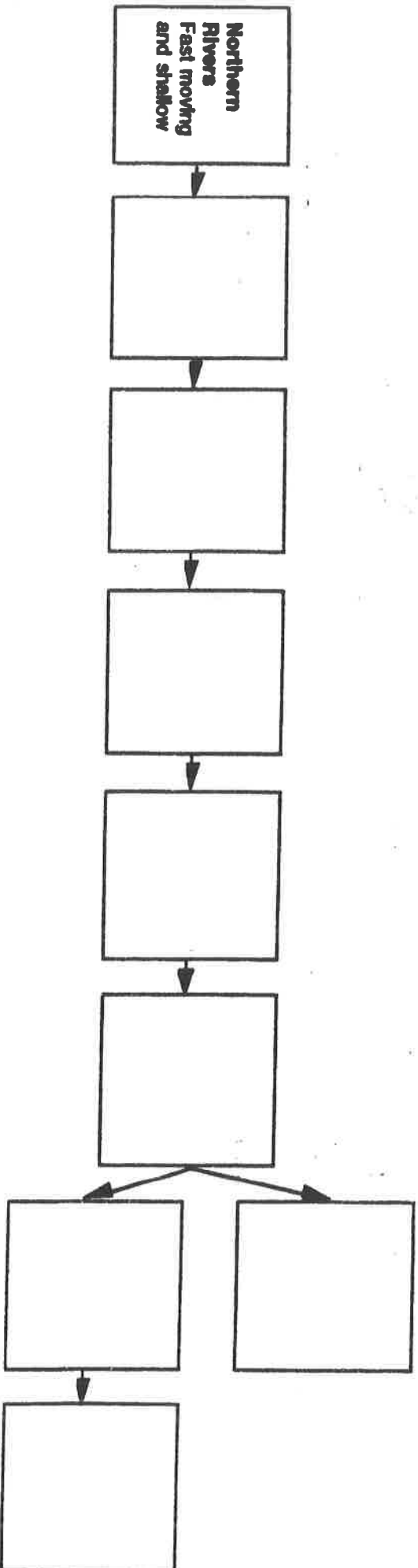
### Southern Climate

- on, tobacco, rice, and indigo grown as cash crops

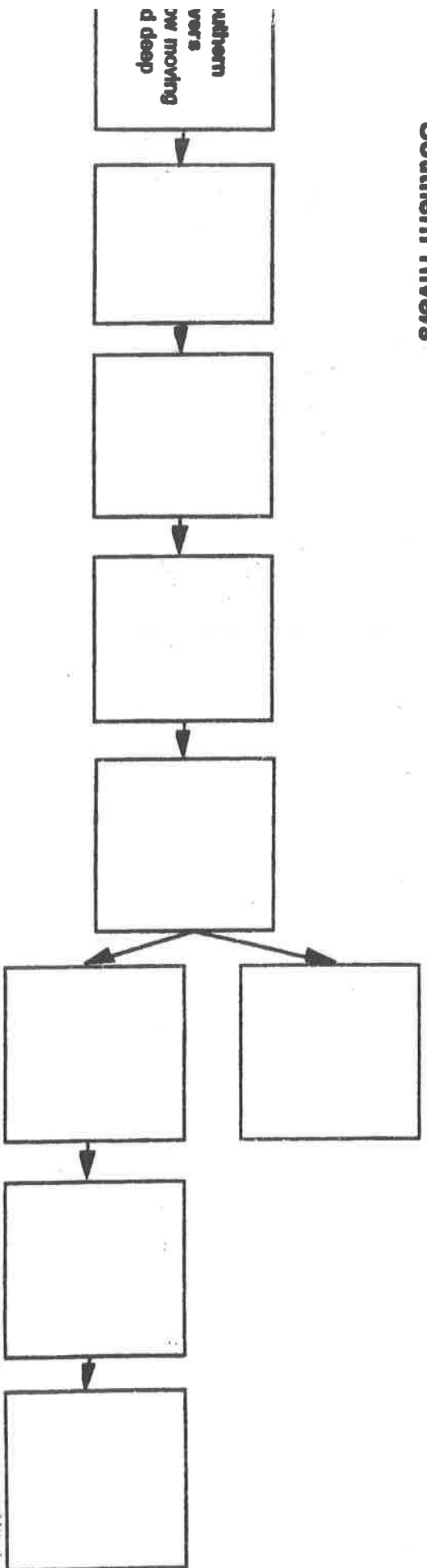
## Northern Rivers

- Immigrants attracted to work opportunities
- People gathered in and near sea ports
- No need for slave labor
- Trade and manufacturing centers emerged
- Many cities developed
- Unnavigable
- Had more power in the House of Representatives than the South
- Large population

## Southern Rivers



**Critical Thinking Question C:** What is the most logical order for arranging these topics in the flow chart?

- Few large cities
- Immigrants not drawn to South
- Less power in the House of Representatives than the North
- Easy navigation and transportation
- Population smaller than in the North
- People lived scattered along rivers
- Agriculture-based economy
- Not much manufacturing
